(A4) **Prevention clinical trial.** The A4 trial is a clinical study for older people between the ages of 65 and 85 who have normal thinking and memory function but who may be at risk for developing memory loss and other symptoms of Alzheimer's disease in the future. The study is designed to evaluate the effectiveness, safety, and tolerability of an investigational drug as a method of prevention of memory loss due to Alzheimer's disease.
